Breaking News: Piscatagua Riverfest

We have learned that the Piscataqua RiverFest will be held this year, on Saturday, June 4th, from 11am to 5pm, in Portsmouth, NH. This is their second time time for their "Annual Event"—the 2020 and 2021 events were canceled. The club exhibited at the first one in 2019, and those that participated found it to be a good event. Tips & Techniques: Glue Joints

How many times have you experienced the need to undo a glue joint? Per Kurt Van Dahm, in the Autumn 2021 NRJ (Nautical Research Journal), almost all glue joints can be dissolved, you just need the right solvent:

- White (Elmer's) the solvent is water.
- Yellow (Titebond) the solvent is isopropyl alcohol.
- Epoxy and CA (Cyanoacrylate) the solvent is acetone.

Success it is a matter of time, patience and gentle force to move the joint apart.

Caution: the liquids we use can or are hazardous. Mineral spirits, lacquer thinner, acetone, isopropyl and denatured alcohol are combustible or flammable and give off hazardous vapors. Work in a vented area and keep away from sources of ignition.
